


Legend

Site Use Rules (Delaware Sites)

- Hours of Use: The sites are open for public use from dawn to dusk.
- A DNREC Permit is required for use of boat ramps.
- Park in designated parking areas only. Rules, as posted in parking areas, will be enforced.
- Motorized on and off road vehicles are not allowed off public roadways. Vehicles include, but are not limited to, four-wheel drive cars, pickups and jeeps, all-terrain vehicles, motorcycles, dirt bikes, golf carts, and snowmobiles.
- No swimming, camping, fires, fireworks, or alcoholic beverages.
- No cutting, removal, or damage of natural resources (vegetation, shrubs, trees, flowers, wetland plants) or cultural / historic resources.
- Littering and/or dumping are prohibited and violators will be prosecuted. Our sites are “carry-in/carry-out” where disposal of trash and garbage is concerned. We investigate and prosecute illegal littering and dumping.
- Hunting and trapping shall be conducted in strict accordance with the regulations of the DNREC Division of Fish & Wildlife, and all applicable statues, regulations and ordinances.
