- Never make an offer for less than the fair market value.
- Take all reasonable steps to minimize the amount of property needed to complete the project.
- Prioritize easements over ownership.

- Maximize the economic benefit to Maryland throughout construction, including use of local Maryland labor, Maryland businesses, and Maryland purchasing to construct the Project.

Public & Worker Safety

- Prioritize the safety of the workers and the public's safety in all communities where the MPRP operates.
